

Map of the British Isles Northern

The four cardinal directions are north (N), east (E), south (S), west (W), at 90° angles on the **compass** rose.

The four intercardinal (or ordinal) directions are formed by bisecting the angle of the cardinal directions: northeast (NE), southeast (SE), southwest (SW) and northwest (NW).
